Hazardous Waste Management Plan Goals 6-10

July 2025



Plan Recommendation 6.6

Evaluate hazardous waste total threshold limit concentration (TTLIC) and soluble threshold limit concentration (STLC) level for lead to reflect current scientific understanding.

Tech Team

Recommendation:

Revise language to better clarify the meaning and intent of this recommendation

Plan Recommendation 7.1

Evaluate non-RCRA waste streams to determine what constituents or properties are causing these wastes to be identified as hazardous.

Tech Team

Recommendation:

Revise to select particular waste streams for evaluation, and to specify the intent of the evaluation

Plan Recommendation 7.3

Determine whether additional reporting methods would be required to obtain information for waste streams currently subject to alternative tracking standards.

Tech Team Recommendation:

- Revise to be more explicit on which waste streams will be reviewed by the 2028 timeline
- Link to Appendix P and explicitly note that the 2028 timeline relates to the next planning cycle in which data and recommendations will be presented

Plan Recommendation 8.4

Amend California Code of Regulation (CCR), title 22, chapter 31, article 1 (commencing with section 67001.1) to explicitly require generators to also submit SB 14 reports or select information from SB 14 reports to a public facing database

Tech Team

Recommendation:

Add that this recommendation enables DTSC to close data gaps for source reduction

Plan Recommendation 8.5

Conduct a study on the types and amounts of household hazardous waste that arrive at non-hazardous waste management facilities (e.g. material recovery facilities, non-hazardous waste landfills, and transfer stations).

Tech Team Recommendations:

- Revise to state:
 - “Evaluate characterization studies performed by CalRecycle on the types and amounts of household hazardous waste that arrive at non-hazardous waste management facilities (e.g. material recovery facilities, non-hazardous waste landfills, and transfer stations)”
- Add a subpart "a" to include outreach to educate the public on household hazardous waste
- Add Environmental Justice (EJ) as a focus area, in that outreach would benefit all communities, primarily those most vulnerable
